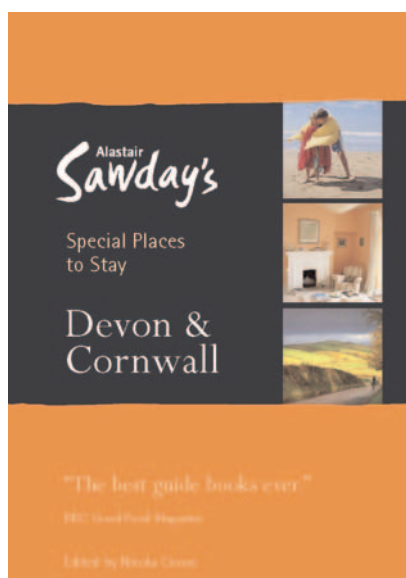




# Devon & Cornwall Edition 1
