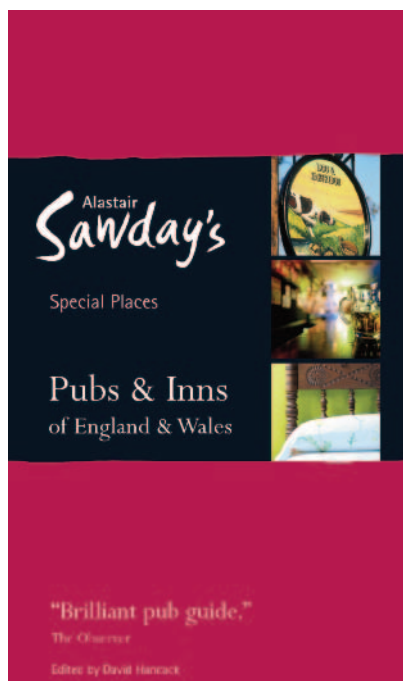




Pubs & Inns of England & Wales

The coastline is magical and the hike to St Ives hard to beat. Secret beaches appear at low tide, cliffs tumble down to the water and wild flowers streak the land pink in summer. As for the pub, you couldn't hope for a better base. It's earthy, warm, stylish and friendly, with airy interiors, colourwashed walls, stripped wooden floors and log fires at both ends of the bar. Maps and art hang on the walls, books fill every shelf; if you can't finish one, take it home and post it back. Rooms are warm and cosy, simple and spotless, with superb mattresses, throws over armchairs, Roberts radios and, in the suite, a lovely big tub. Downstairs, super food, all homemade, can be eaten wherever you want: in the bar, in the restaurant or out in the garden in good weather. Snack on rustic delights – pork pies, crab claws, half a pint of Atlantic prawns – or tuck into more substantial treats: fresh asparagus with a hollandaise sauce, fish stew with new potatoes, rhubarb crème brûlée. Picnics are easily arranged, there's bluegrass folk music in the bar most weeks, and the St Ives-Penzance bus runs right outside – a huge plus.
