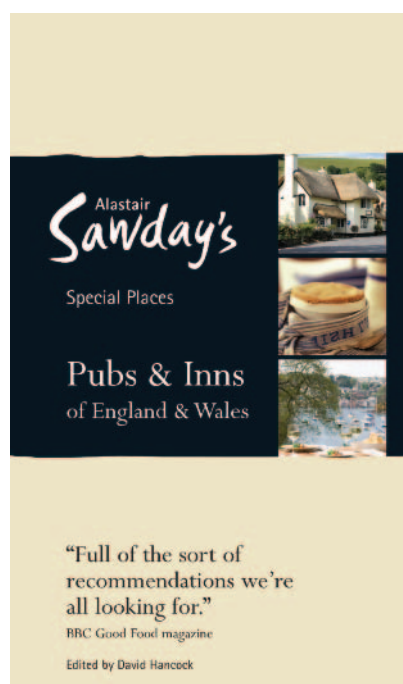




# Pubs & Inns of England & Wales

#### The Globe Inn

Wells-next-the-Sea

Set back a few hundred yards from the bustling harbour at Wells, the Globe sits on leafy Buttlands Green. The 19th-century coaching inn is owned by Tom and Polly Coke, who transformed the Victoria on their family estate at Holkham. It's a big hit with visitors and locals alike, a warm mishmash of old furniture, wooden boards, big wood-burner and antique lighting while the restaurant, done up in New England style, has a reputation for food that's English, unfussy, fresh and modern. Some meat comes from the estate and only the season's best will do: Thornham mussels, rib-eye of Holkham beef with béarnaise, fish chowder, local rabbit, pigeon and estate-reared venison. On sunny days you can take your plates and your pints (Adnams, Woodforde's) out into the red-brick courtyard. Bedrooms have been smartened up and are as fresh and untraditional as can be, with oak floors, iron beds, crisp linen, big baths and monsoon showers. The ones at the front get the views; six new rooms will be added in 2010. Children and dogs like it too, what with child-size pies, crabbing on the quay and walks on the hugest beach ever.
