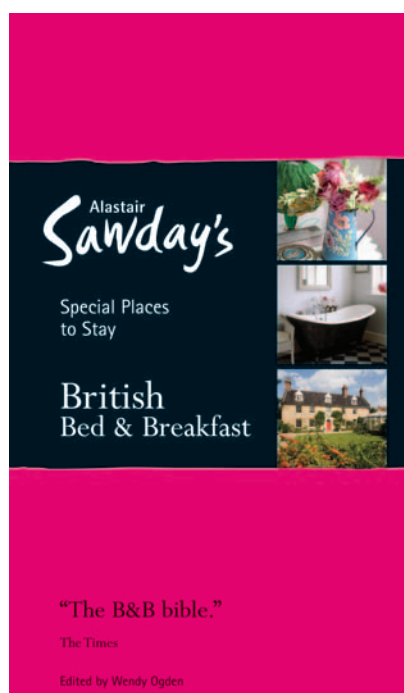




British Bed & Breakfast
